

SCHEDULE 1

YOUTH OLYMPIC QUALIFICATION REQUIREMENTS

SNOWBOARD

1. Quota places won for the Lausanne 2020 Youth Olympic Winter Games are available to the NOC and not to the individual athletes.
2. The total number of quota places available in Snowboard are as follows:
 - i. Snowboard Cross 48. The maximum number of athlete quota places available per NOC is 4, with a maximum number of 2* Men and 2* Women quota places available.
 - ii. Snowboard Halfpipe is 40. The maximum number of athlete quota places available per NOC is 4, with a maximum number of 2* Men and 2* Women quota places available.
 - iii. Snowboard Slopestyle/Big Air is 40. The maximum number of athlete quota places available per NOC is 4, with a maximum number of 2* Men and 2* Women quota places available.
*Maximum of three (3) male and three (3) female athletes per individual event, as described in D.6 Additional participation for athletes already qualified.

3. In the event that the NOC qualifies quota places pursuant to the qualification pathways set out in section D of the IOC/ FIS qualification document dated 1st December 2018 (as may be amended from time to time) ("[IOC/FIS Standards](#)"), the BOA will only accept as nominations for those quota places any individual(s) who:

- i. comply with any eligibility criteria as set out in the IOC/FIS Standards, including (but not limited to) in Section C; and

- ii. Snowboard Cross
2002 – 2003 YOB

- i. A criteria (2002 YOB)

Achieved top 67.5% in Snowboard Cross Junior World Championships

OR

2 x top 50% at Snowboard Cross FIS events

- ii. B criteria (2003 YOB)

Competed in 2 x Snowboard Cross FIS events

AND

achieved top 67.5% in one FIS event

If there are more athletes eligible and qualified for selection than quota places allocated, the selection panel has absolute discretion to select athletes who, in their reasonable opinion, are most likely to achieve the best result at the Youth Olympic Games.

Such factors that may be considered but not limited to, (in no priority), will be:

- athletes' FIS ranking in the eligible discipline during the 2019/2020 season;
- results obtained in competitions during the qualification period generally, with greater emphasis on more recent results in order to select on current form

- iii. Snowboard Halfpipe
2002 – 2004 YOB

- i. Selection for Snowboard Halfpipe events will be made on a case by case application basis. For further details email maddy.hunter@gbsnowsport.com.

Each case will be considered in relation to current world class performance levels.

For MEN and WOMEN, should the numbers of persons the selection committee deem of sufficient standard be greater than the number of quota spots, all candidates for the quota spot shall be ranked using the following secondary criteria, all of which shall be considered for each candidate. If, when considering these secondary criteria, the Panel is satisfied that a person whose performances during the 18/19 season at FIS World Junior Championships did not result in a quota spot is, nevertheless, likely to achieve a top 3 result in the YOG in preference to one who earned the quota spot, the person judged likely to achieve top 3 shall be ranked above all those considered unlikely to do so. The criteria to be considered are:

1. A person who has a top 3 result in any of the eligible competitions in the 18/19 and 19/20 seasons listed here shall have precedence over one who does not; FIS World Junior Champs, FIS World Cup, FIS Europa Cup, Rookie Tour events - Rookie section (i.e. not GROM section)
2. Each candidate's two best results during the 18/19 and 19/20 seasons shall be compared;
3. Each candidate's Performance Profile must indicate that their current form is such as to support nomination, and shall also be used to inform the judgment whether that candidate is likely to achieve a top 3 result at YOG 2020.

iv. Snowboard Slopestyle/Big Air
2002- 2004 YOB

- i. Male athletes must profile at level 6 on the traffic lights profile tool, 2018 edition, equivalent to a trick performance level of one 1080 with grabs on a large kicker.
- ii. Female athletes must profile at level 3+ on the traffic lights profile tool, edition 2018, equivalent to a trick performance level of two 540s performed in different directions with grabs on a large kicker.

For both MEN and WOMEN, should the number of persons that meet the above criteria be greater than the number of quota spots, all candidates for the quota spot shall be ranked using the following secondary criteria, all of which shall be considered for each candidate. If, when considering these secondary criteria, the Panel is satisfied that a person whose performances during the 18/19 season at FIS World Junior Championships did not result in a quota spot is, nevertheless, likely to achieve a top 3 result in the YOG in preference to one who earned the quota spot, the person judged likely to achieve top 3 shall be ranked above all those considered unlikely to do so. The criteria to be considered are:

1. A person who has a top 3 result in any of the eligible competitions in the 18/19 and 19/20 seasons listed here shall have precedence over one who does not; FIS World Junior Champs, FIS World Cup, FIS Europa Cup, Rookie Tour events - Rookie section (i.e. not GROM section)

4. The BOA will consider eligible for selection individual athletes who have been nominated under the GBS Selection Policy for the Games by 10th December 2019.
